Timothy J. Keegan is an experienced professional possessing expertise in business management, organizational design and strategic transformation programs, policy formulation and economic analysis. He possesses an extensive background working with senior government, political, community leadership and media personnel. A persuasive spokesperson with extensive media experience, Mr. Keegan is a dedicated advocate with a reputation built upon integrity. A native of South Florida, Mr. Keegan has held a number of elected and appointed offices within Florida.



In addition to his professional and civic responsibilities, in 2003 Mr. Keegan was appointed by Lieutenant General Ron Helmly, (then) the Chief of the US Army Reserve (USAR) to serve as the USAR Ambassador for Florida. In this (“two-star” equivalent) position, Ambassador Keegan worked with Federal, State and local elected leaders to support the Army Reserve’s legislative initiatives, provide guidance to USAR leadership and recognize citizen soldiers and their families throughout the State of Florida.



In 2006, after successfully lobbying for increased recruitment ages for prospective National Guard and Reserve Soldiers, Mr. Keegan resigned his Ambassadorship and was accepted for duty (at the age of 44) as a uniformed member of the Army Reserve. In 2009, Keegan volunteered for a combat assignment to Afghanistan where he supported US Special Operations Command and the Joint Intelligence Operations Center, (JIOC-A). Having distinguished himself during his deployment, Keegan was presented with the prestigious Defense Meritorious Service Medal in recognition of his contributions to the Afghan NATO / ISAF mission.

In March of 2010, Keegan received the Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal from the Military Intelligence Readiness Command (MIRC) in recognition of his leadership in amassing and distributing 1,200,000 lbs. of food, water, medical equipment and supplies to the people of Haiti following that country’s devastating earthquake. Captain Keegan was honored as a recipient of the MI Corps Association, “Knowlton Award” presented to individuals who have contributed significantly to the promotion of US Army Intelligence in the eyes of previous recipients, military superiors, subordinates, and peers. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Keegan was named a finalist for the prestigious MG Strom Thurmond Reserve Officers Association (ROA) Outstanding Junior Officer of the Year Award. In 2014 Keegan was named a recipient of the General MacArthur Leadership Award. Captain Keegan was Honorably separated from military service in 2020.

In his most recent corporate capacity, Mr. Keegan was a Senior Vice President with Bank of America Private Bank. He resigned this position in November 2022, in order to focus on his role as volunteer CEO of the Coalition of Hope Foundation (COH). Established in 2005, COH is a US-based 501(c) (3), non-profit, charitable organization that provides global humanitarian assistance and disaster-relief support. Based upon his many charitable endeavors, Mr. Keegan was nominated for the 2013 Presidential Citizens Award, considered the second highest civilian award in the United States, second only to the Presidential Medal of Freedom. In 2017, Mr. Keegan was nominated by the White House for the position of Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense. In 2020, 2021 and 2022 Mr. Keegan was named a recipient of the Bank of America Global Volunteer Award and concurrently awarded the (US) President’s Silver Volunteer Service Award.

Mr. Keegan holds a Bachelor’s Degree from Florida State University and is working towards a Master’s Degree from the American Military University. He and his family reside in Palm Beach, Florida.
