By converting ships designed for 'storming the beaches' into humanitarian 'storm the beaches' with relief supplies etc, is a brilliant application of resources. There have so many situations where logistics was a limiting factor. As a civilian vessel, it can readily navigate to any location. It can not only be used to 'deliver the goods', but also be outfitted with state of the art medical and communications equipment.
